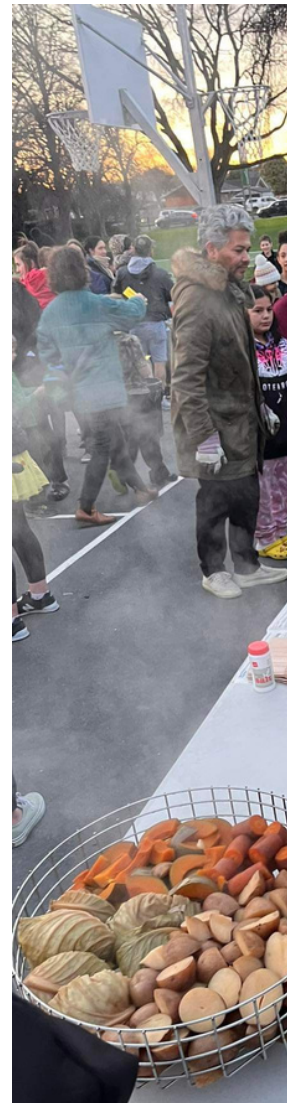

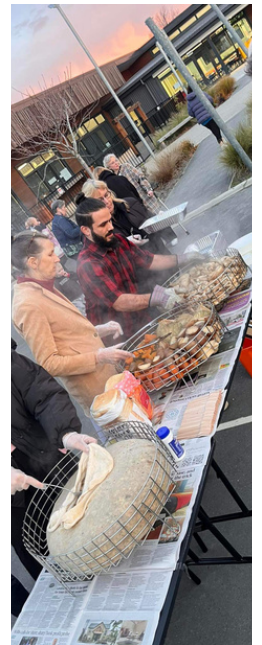
We have developed a website for Cross Over this year. You can now find us at crossovertrust.org

Overflowing has been a word to describe our past year! School roles and classes expanding, new faces to meet, relationships to develop and challenges to overcome.

But overflowing with opportunities to meet new people, bring the community together to help others, and build support networks.

Due to a grant from Christchurch City Council, we have been able to purchase and install a fridge system in Addington to support our Fruit and Vege Pop Up. We also organize volunteers to prepare meals that can be frozen and then given out to those in need in the community.

We have continued to strengthen relationships with other community organisations such as Manuka Cottage, Addington Farm, and community working bees. Friends of Addington Park has grown and inputted into making our green spaces safer and happier places to be for our tamariki.

English classes have been great places of connection, learning and support for families new to New Zealand.

Rowley continues to be an awesome, diverse community to be a part of. We have seen lots of new whanau moving into the area due to housing intensification and we have focused on welcoming and getting to know as many as we can.

Community Hangi were well attended and provided a point of connection and inclusion. We also hosted Welcome Afternoon Teas for parents/caregivers at school to answer questions and introduce ourselves.

We discovered parents with a passion for sport and tamariki and gave them the opportunity and assistance to coach netball teams. They loved seeing the confidence and resilience building in the tamariki over the season.

Our Afterschool Sport and Waiata was well attended with numbers increased over the year, demonstrating increasing need for this in the community.

Hoon Hay Fiesta which was transferred last minute to Te Kōmanawa Rowley School due to poor weather, and Ki-o-Rahi organized by Origin Sport at our local park were also highlights and accessible spaces for the community to come together.

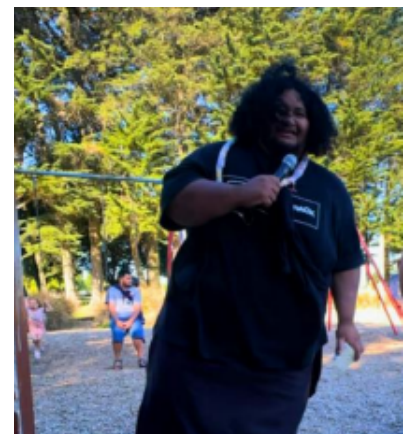

The Community Hangi have been a great place of connection and gathering and learning together. We have had large turnouts and good weather to assist!

We have supported tamariki/children to engage with sports and active play to build a healthier lifestyle. We have seen our 1:1 mentoring impacting and supporting tamariki to engage with their school community.



ORIGIN SPORT

One highlight in 2024 was expanding and delivering weekly Ki-o-Rahi across Term 2 & 3 for the first time. Using the Eastern Canopy at Rawhiti Domain as the venue meant many new faces came, as well as providing a chance to play year-round for those who are really enthusiastic about Ki-o-Rahi because of their experiences at Hoon Hay Park.

Surfing with the students from Te Komanawa Rowley continues to be an annual highlight. We see a huge improvement in their confidence and ability in a short space of time. One child had never seen the sea before, so this was an exciting opportunity for him to experience something he could not have otherwise.

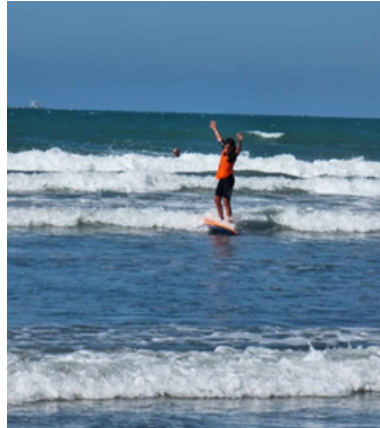
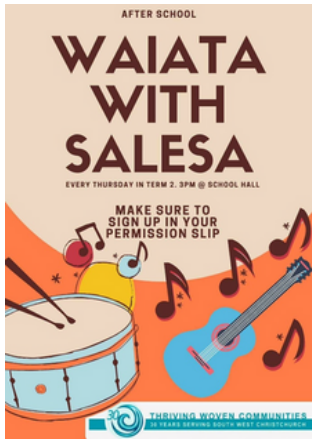
